Bjarki Hallgrimsson is an Associate Professor in the School of Industrial Design at Carleton University. The Design Innovation for Disability in Kasese project teamed students in the School of Industrial Design with the READ initiative at Carleton and grassroots organizations of People With Disabilities in western Uganda through an Ottawa based NGO called CanUgan. The challenge was to help develop products that could be built locally and that would involve the end users in the development effort more clearly through a co-design process. The focus was on the design development of a better hand operated tricycle and products that would help empower PWD's economically.
