Dr. Kevin Spooner is Associate Professor of North American Studies and History and is Coordinator of the North American Studies Program at Wilfrid Laurier University. His research has examined the history of Canadian peacekeeping in the Congo and was published with UBC Press: *Canada, the Congo Crisis, and United Nations Peacekeeping, 1960-64*, a book that was awarded the C. P. Stacey Prize. His current research interests relate to Canadian foreign policy with English-speaking Africa from the 1950s to the late 1960s.
