In this seminar, Melissa Armstrong discusses her current research on the history of health in the camps of the military wing of the African National Congress (ANC), Umkhonto weSizwe (MK), during the South African liberation struggle. After establishing some of the context for health and health infrastructure while in exile, Melissa argues that the implementation of health care runs parallel to the ANC's broader political, economic and social realities.
