Archbishop Pius Ncube, Catholic Archbishop of Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, is co-chairperson of Solidarity Peace Trust, a South African-registered non-governmental organization that seeks to build solidarity in pursuit of justice, peace and social equality and equity in Zimbabwe (see <http://www.solidaritypeacetrust.org/>). Archbishop Ncube has been an outspoken critic of the human rights record of the Zimbabwean government and the trenchant economic crisis in this southern African country. His public criticisms have earned him both praise by many and wrath of the ruling party. While admirers have called him the “Desmond Tutu of Zimbabwe,” in reference to the Nobel Peace Prize winning anti-apartheid church leader in South Africa, President Mugabe has vehemently denounced him as an “unholy man.”
