# The Bulgarian Road to the EU

June 1990 election results for the Grand National Assembly

BSP- 47.15% UDF (SDS)- 36.20%

BSP- 106 MPs


Exports

\$22.71 billion (2008 est.), 69th in the world, better than Estonia and Latvia \$18.58 billion (2007 est.)

Exports: clothing, footwear, iron and steel, machinery and equipment, fuels

Partners for exports: Greece 9.9%, Germany 9.2%, Turkey 8.9%, Italy 8.5%, Romania 7.2%, Belgium 5.9%, France 4.1% (2008)

#### **Human Development Index Trend**



- Electricity Production- CIA World Factbook Data 40.25 billion kWh (2007 est.), 53rd in the world, better position than Hungary, Slovakia, Ireland and Denmark
- Life Expectancy in Bulgaria CIA World Factbook 73.9 years Estonia- 72.82 years Romania-72.45 years Latvia- 72.15 years WORLD AVERAGE- 66.57 YEARS

- HIV Cases- Bulgaria is 153<sup>rd</sup> out of 165 countries
   Only Slovakia and Slovenia have fewer cases
   than Bulgaria in the EU
- According to Health Consumer Powerhouse Index 2008, Bulgaria has a better quality healthcare system than Croatia, Latvia and Canada <a href="http://www.healthpowerhouse.com/files/2008-EHCI/EHCI-2008-report.pdf">http://www.healthpowerhouse.com/files/2008-EHCI/EHCI-2008-report.pdf</a>
- Internet Users: 2.64 million
   This is better in % of the population than Latvia, Lithuania and Croatia

- Petty crime is a concern in Sofia, although less widespread than in most Western European cities. Organized criminal groups are involved in casinos, nightclubs, and prostitution. Violent crime, although rare, occurs.
- Homicide rate per 100,000 people- UN statistics
   Bulgaria: 2000-4.07; 2003-3.15; 2009-3.08
   2009: USA- 5.4; Canada- 1.83; Austria- 0.73
- 2009: Columbia-36; South Africa-37; Venezuela-52
- Migration rate: -3.11 migrants/1000 people (2009), for comparison: Estonia: -3.26/1000

#### Challenges to Bulgaria as a EU Member

- low salaries and pensions, (average GDP for the EU per capita 33, 700);
- enlarging the international educational cooperation;
- improvement of the conditions in mental health institutions;
- corruption and effective sentences for high profile corruption cases;
- bigger transparency for the money spent on EU-funded and Bulgarian government-funded projects;
- nepotism and more careful checks of the background of candidates for political offices, especially for EU, UN and other international organizations;
- better integration of the Roma minority stricter application of antiracist and anti-xenophobic laws;
- improving the Bulgarian immigration and refugee legislature as well as control of the treatment of detained refugees by the Bulgarian authorities;
- restricting GMO on Bulgarian territory and preserving the Bulgarian nature- destruction of illegal hotels and villas;
- decentralization of the government institutions, encouraging and creating employment opportunities across the country;
