EU LAW OVER MEMBER STATE LAW: A CONTROVERSIAL SUBJECT?

The topic of this talk touches upon the idea of supremacy, how it was established early on in the jurisprudence of the European Court of Justice and how, more recently, it has become surprisingly controversial. Dr. Larouche is Professor of Competition Law at Tilburg University and Co-Director of the Tilburg Law and Economics Center (TILEC). He is also a professor at the College of Europe (Bruges). A graduate of McGill University, he clerked at the Supreme Court of Canada, obtained his masters from Bonn University and his Ph.D. from the University of Maastricht. His teaching and research interests include competition law, telecommunications law, media law, basic EU law and the common European law of torts, with the help of economic analysis and a comparative perspective.
