The successful candidate must have graduate level course work in areas of teaching. A Ph.D. is required for tenure-track appointment. A Master's degree with considerable experience could be considered.

Teaching Load: Six term courses or equivalent per year.

Research Duties:

All tenure-track faculty members are expected to engage in scholarly activity (some combination of discovery/integration/application/pedagogy/engagement) and to publish results. In the case of a clinical psychology appointment, part-time active clinical practice, and publishable reflections on that practice, may be considered as significantly contributing towards this scholarly requirement.

Particulars of the Position:

The successful candidate must be able to teach courses in Introductory Psychology, Clinical Psychology, Counseling, and Abnormal Psychology. Additional course assignments could include one or more of Testing & Assessment, Community Psychology, Health Psychology, or Developmental Psychology. Supervision of research projects for students in their senior undergraduate years is expected. Clinical experience is a highly desirable asset. The Psychology Department at King's co-operates in a broad multidisciplinary initiative to serve organizations, agencies, and communities beyond the campus through provision of community engaged research; preference will be given to candidates with experience in, or demonstrating capacity for, community engaged research. The successful candidate will contribute to a growing and dynamic four-year B.A. with a psychology major and a three-year B.A. with a psychology concentration in which psychology is integrated in a liberal arts context (http://www.kingsu.ca/programs/majors/psychology). Experience and/or interest in team-teaching and interdisciplinary teaching or research is welcome. The successful candidate should be able to articulate, develop, and model a Christian approach to psychology in teaching, clinical practice, and research, recognizing how faith shapes the theory, methods, and practice of the discipline.
