Please limit abstracts to 250 words. Abstracts should outline the paper's research design, methodology and preliminary sources. Submissions will be accepted between November 1 and December 1, 2013.

For students coming from outside the Ottawa area, limited funding may be available to offset travel costs. Please indicate whether you require assistance when submitting your abstract.
