

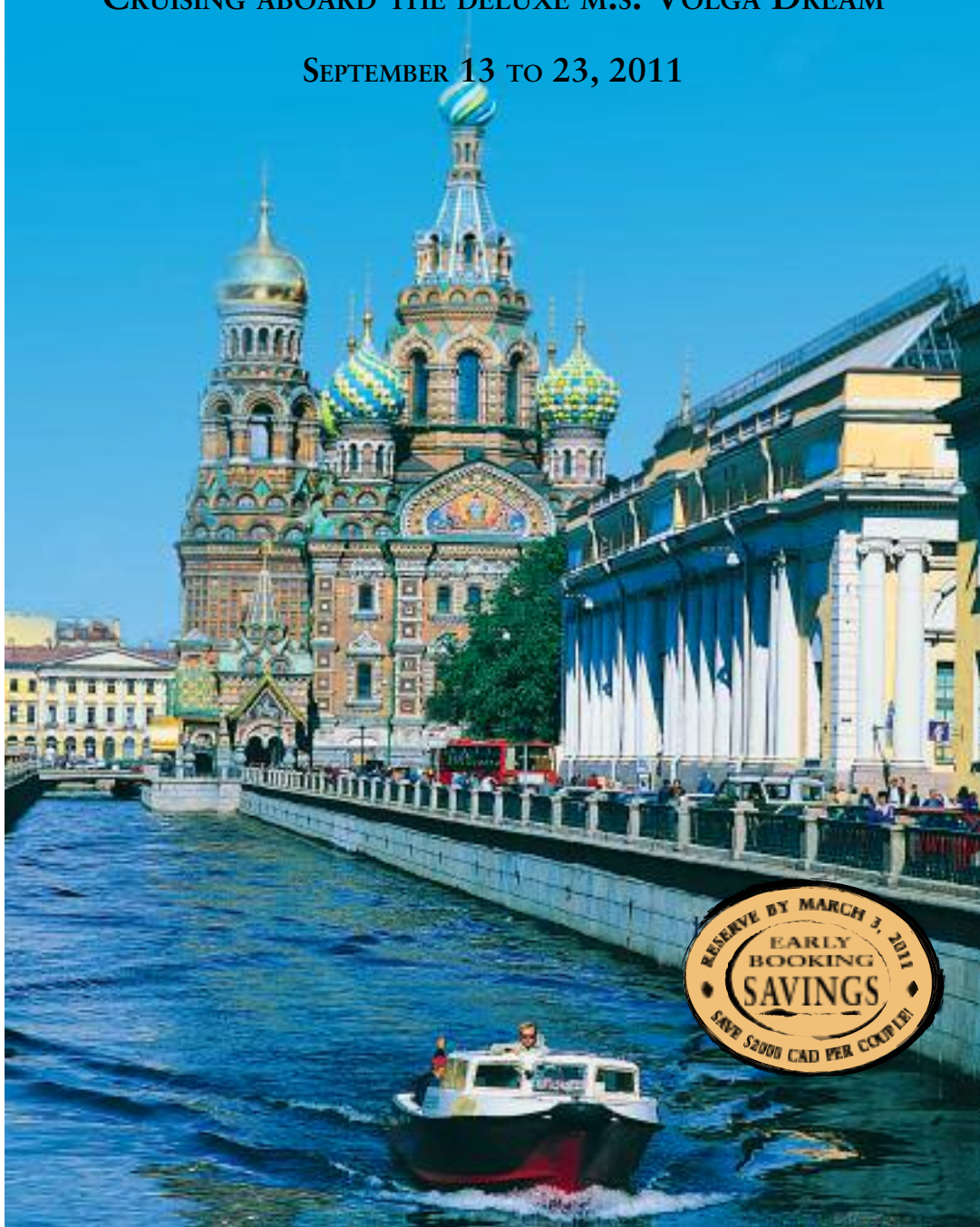

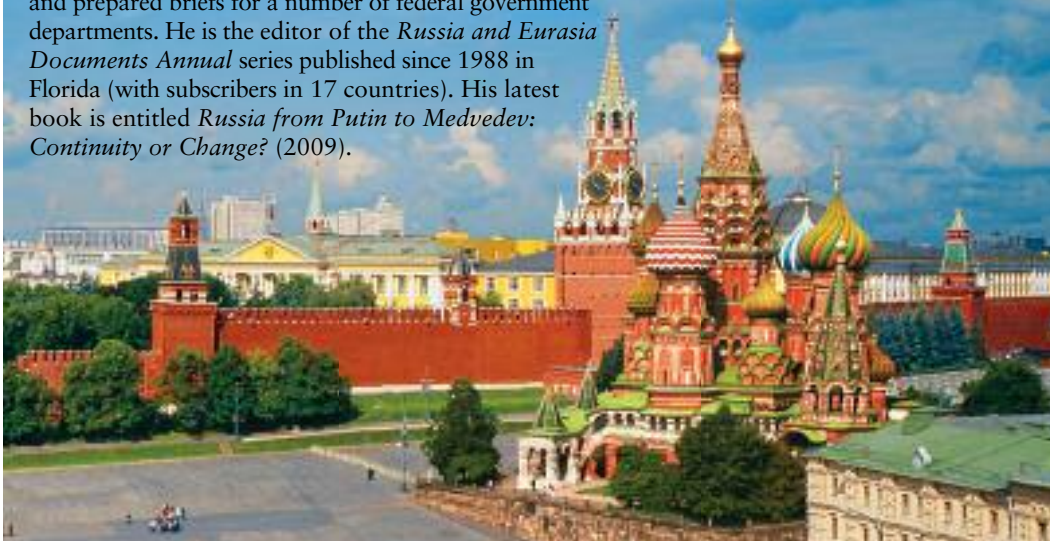

J.L. (Larry) Black is a Distinguished Research Professor at Carleton University and founding director of the Centre for Research on Canadian-Russian Relations (CRCR), University Partnership Centre, Georgian College, in Barrie, Ontario. A former faculty member of Carleton's History Department for thirty years and Director of the Institute for Soviet and East European Studies from 1982 to 1990, Dr. Black holds degrees from Mount Allison, Boston University and McGill, and has written, edited or co-edited some 35 books on Russian and Soviet history, politics, foreign policy and Canadian-Soviet relations. Dr. Black has served as a researcher for NATO and prepared briefs for a number of federal government departments. He is the editor of the *Russia and Eurasia Documents Annual* series published since 1988 in Florida (with subscribers in 17 countries). His latest book is entitled *Russia from Putin to Medvedev: Continuity or Change?* (2009).



CANADA

Tuesday, September 13

Depart from Canada on an overnight flight to St. Petersburg, Russia.

ST. PETERSBURG, RUSSIA

Wednesday, September 14

Arrive in St. Petersburg and meet your Travel Director. Transfer to the deluxe M.S. VOLGA DREAM, docked on the great Neva River, which flows majestically through the heart of St. Petersburg. Aboard ship, enjoy a welcome reception and dinner this evening.

The ship remains docked overnight.

ST. PETERSBURG

Thursday, September 15

Enjoy exploring the city's legendary landmarks, which are scattered across more than 100 islands linked by six times as many bridges. St. Petersburg's main thoroughfare, Nevsky Prospekt, showcases exquisite examples of Russian Baroque and neoclassical architecture. On the morning tour, see the beautiful Church of Our Saviour on Spilled Blood (Church of the Resurrection of Christ), built on the site of Emperor Alexander II's assassination, and the 19th-century St. Isaac's Cathedral, with a striking golden dome that is one of the glories of the city's skyline. Tour the city's oldest edifice, the Peter and Paul Fortress, built in 1703 to guard the country's only outlet to the Baltic Sea. The impressive Baroque Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul contains

the tombs of 32 czars, from Peter the Great to Nicholas II, the last of the Romanovs.

Later, join the optional excursion, including lunch, to the imperial compound of *Tsarskoye Selo* ("Czar's Village") in Pushkin and tour Catherine the Great's elaborate Baroque palace, built in 1741, highlighted by a special visit to the restoration workshops. See the extraordinary Amber Room: six tons of solid amber, deftly carved and framed in gold leaf, once deemed the "Eighth Wonder of the World." Stripped and confiscated by the Nazis in 1941, the Amber Room was meticulously reconstructed in 2003 in honour of St. Petersburg's 300th birthday.

This evening, attend an optional ballet performance in the Hermitage or Palace Theater (performance schedule permitting).

ST. PETERSBURG

Friday, September 16

Enjoy a specially arranged, early-opening tour of the State Hermitage Museum, former palace of Catherine the Great and repository of one of the world's oldest and greatest art collections. View the priceless collection of 19th- and 20th-century French Impressionist and Post-Impressionist works as well as the controversial group of 74 masterpieces "lost" in a storeroom since World War II and found in 1995. Its spectacular collection is rivalled only by the museum's ornate interiors.

The afternoon is yours in St. Petersburg, or you can choose to join the optional

excursion to skim over the Gulf of Finland by hydrofoil to Petrodvorets, the splendid palaces and parklands commissioned by Peter the Great and now a UNESCO World Heritage site. Following lunch upon arrival, stroll through the scenic Lower Park and tour the magnificent Grand Palace.

The ship departs this evening.

NEVA RIVER/LAKE LADOGA/ MANDROGI/SVIR RIVER/ LAKE ONEGA

Saturday, September 17

Be on deck to admire the passing wilderness of serene meadows and virgin pine and birch forests. The ship calls at Mandrogi, a small riverside village. Afterward, cruise the sparkling Svir River between Lake Ladoga, the largest freshwater reservoir in Europe, and Lake Onega, known for its almost 1400 islands.

This evening, enjoy a dinner that will include traditional Russian specialties.

KIZHI ISLAND/LAKE ONEGA

Sunday, September 18

Rise early to see the unforgettable approach to picturesque Kizhi Island, a UNESCO World Heritage site. This remarkable open-air museum is a treasure trove of 18th-century Karelian and north Russian wooden architecture. Admire the Transfiguration Church, an architectural masterpiece featuring 22 cupolas built completely of wood without a single nail!

This afternoon, cruise Lake Onega, surrounded by the beautifully untouched Russian countryside.

LAKE BELOYE/GORITSY/ SHEKSNA RIVER

Monday, September 19

Along the shores of Lake Beloye, see rural communities continuing the traditions of Old Russia.

From the tranquil village of Goritsy, visit the Kirillo-Belozersky Monastery, founded in 1397. It is said that Vasily III, the first Czar of Russia, came here to pray for an heir, and soon after, his wife Elena gave birth to the future Ivan the Terrible. Along the Sheksna River, catch glimpses of a bygone era as you pass rustic family farms and quaint *dachas*, the seasonal cottages of Russia's elite.

After dinner this evening, enjoy a specially arranged sampling of Russian vodkas.

The Russian wooden architecture on Kizhi Island is replete with perfectly crafted domes and cupolas that rise above the trees.





Admire the magnificent fountains and gilded statues at Petrodvorets, Peter the Great's summer palace.

LAKE RYBINSKOYE/YAROSLAVL

Tuesday, September 20

This morning, the ship cruises through the scenic wilderness of Lake Rybinskoye. After lunch, dock in Yaroslavl, the oldest town on the Volga River and one of the "Golden Ring" of fortified cities surrounding Moscow. This UNESCO World Heritage site is also known as the "Florence of Russia," and is famous for its authentic Russian churches with their painted onion domes and soaring turrets.

Stroll along the river to the Church of Elijah the Prophet, a masterpiece of local architecture located in the heart of the Old Town and filled with well-preserved frescoes. Then see the fortified Monastery of the Transfiguration, founded in the 12th century.

Entered by the Church of the Transfiguration's ensemble waters of Lake Onega.



UGLICH/VOLGA RIVER

Wednesday, September 21

In the 10th-century "Golden Ring" town of Uglich, walk to the small 17th-century Church of Prince Dimitri-on-the-Blood, built on the site where Ivan the Terrible's young son met his demise. Admire its cluster of red turrets capped with spangled blue onion domes and the elegant frescoes that adorn the inside. Continue to the stately five-domed Cathedral of the Transfiguration to view the ornate icons throughout the cathedral's large, vaulted interior.

This afternoon, cruise the Volga River, the main artery of the Russian heartland for over a millennium, and into the Moscow Canal, an impressive system of 11 locks over 80 miles. Attend the Captain's farewell reception this evening.

MOSCOW

Thursday, September 22

Cruise into the Russian capital city along the Moscow River, which leisurely flows through the city that has embodied the heart and soul of Russia for over 850 years.

Explore Moscow's cultural and historical treasures beginning with a visit to the imposing halls of the Kremlin, the fabled "Citadel of the Czars." Tour the Armory, the oldest museum in Russia, and see the authentic State treasures including the magnificently bejeweled Fabergé Easter eggs commissioned by the Romanov czars.

Walk around infamous Red Square, a UNESCO World Heritage site where both



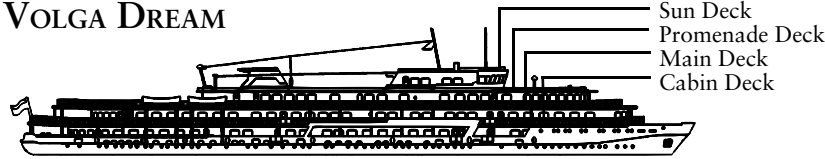
