

The Basics of Dynamic Assessment for Sexual Offenders: STABLE-2007 and ACUTE-2007 Training 2-day workshop

Participants will be trained to assess dynamic predictors of risk for sexual offenders. Training will focus on the administration, scoring, and interpretation of the STABLE-2007 and the ACUTE-2007. Also, this session will cover how dynamic risk factors are used in the treatment and management of sexual offenders. Some knowledge of static risk assessment with sex offenders is assumed. Recently, three new validation studies show that dynamic prediction tools (STABLE-2007) are capable of extending the predictive validity of risk assessments beyond static, actuarial assessments alone. This applied workshop is appropriate for all who assess and manage risk, plan treatment and supervision for community-based and incarcerated sexual offenders. This workshop will contain multiple practice exercises; those who wish, at the end of day two, may submit completed exercises for marking and feedback. Those who meet standard will be provided with a certificate of training certification.

Andrew J. R. Harris, Ph.D., C. Psych. did his doctoral research on the intersection of Hare's (1991) conception of criminal psychopathy and levels of sexual deviance as assessed in a probation and parole sample. Dr. Harris is Director of the Forensic Assessment Group (www.offenderrisk.com) based in Ottawa, Canada. He has been previously employed in both research and clinical capacities by the Solicitor General Canada, the Correctional Service of Canada, the Province of Ontario at the Oak Ridge (Maximum Security) division of the Penetanguishene Mental Health Centre, and at a general medical hospital, York Central Hospital, Richmond Hill, Ontario. Dr. Harris speaks extensively on the history of prison architecture, risk assessment for violent, sexual, and pornography offenders, psychopathy, high-risk offenders, and sexual offenders with prominent cognitive delays.
