

Contract Instructor Opportunity, Winter 2016 Carleton University, Department of History

The Department of History is seeking a qualified contract instructor for the Winter 2016 session. As a general rule, the minimum qualification is a Ph.D. in the appropriate field. Terms and conditions of employment are set out in the Collective Agreement between Carleton University and CUPE Local 4600, unit 2.

The course for which a contract instructor is currently being sought is:

HIST 2510A [0.5 credit], 19th-Century Germany

The social, cultural, and political history and impact of German nationhood. Topics include the rise of social democracy and the feminist movements, alliance and empire building, scientific racism, sexology, and the emancipation and assimilation of German Jews into the body politic. Winter, late afternoon.

Candidates should have a record of publications in the history of modern Germany. They are required to have experience in teaching German history and competence in the supervision of teaching assistants.

The course is currently scheduled in the winter term on Mondays from 1435-1625 with discussion groups on Tuesdays (835-925 & 1235-1325).
