

Kanta Marwah Research Grant in Peace and Security

Application Form

This research grant was established as a memorial to Mahatma (M.K.) Gandhi, and in recognition of the work being carried by an international group of *Economists for Peace and Security (EPS)*, and *Mahatma Gandhi Peace Council of Ottawa* to support research in Peace and Security, Conflict Resolution and Human Development.

Terms and Eligibility

Applications are required; competition is open to doctoral students/faculty members /visiting research scholars at Carleton for the grant period (6 months, January 1-June 30.) for research in topics related to Peace and Security, Conflict Resolution and Human Development. The student must be enrolled in a graduate program at Carleton University for the entire period of the award. The winner will be chosen by a committee comprised of the Carleton University academic members of the Board of the Canada-India Centre for Excellence in Science, Technology, Trade and Policy, and chaired by the Dean of the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Affairs. The winner will be recognized as the Centre's scholar, and he/she will duly acknowledge the grant in any report/working paper/publication based on the research facilitated by this grant. The scholar will be required to submit a report to the Centre at the end of the grant period.

This award is valued at \$10,000.00 for the 2013/2014 academic year.
