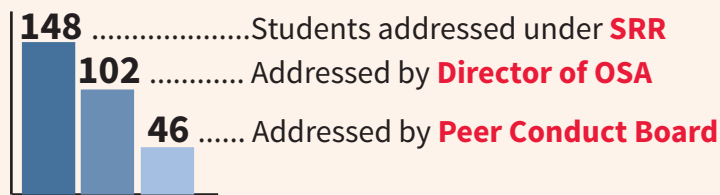


OFFICE OF STUDENT AFFAIRS

The SRR policy is Carleton's student code of conduct. Hearings under the SRR take place with the Director, Student Affairs or the Peer Conduct Board

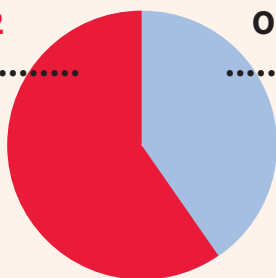

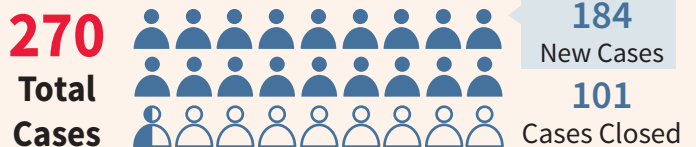

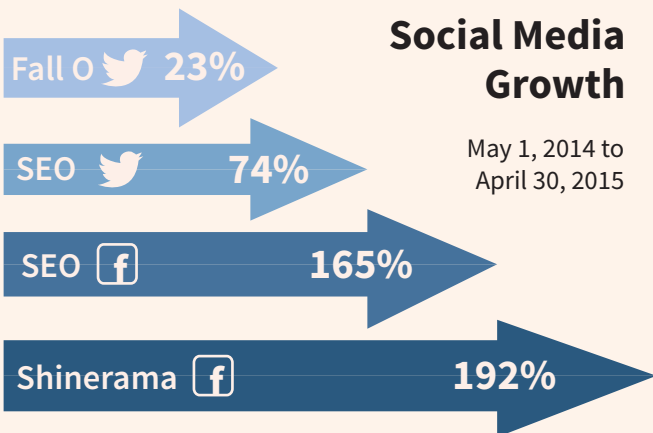
First-in-Family Connections

The FIF Connections program is a mentorship & community building program designed to support First Generation students in their transition to university.



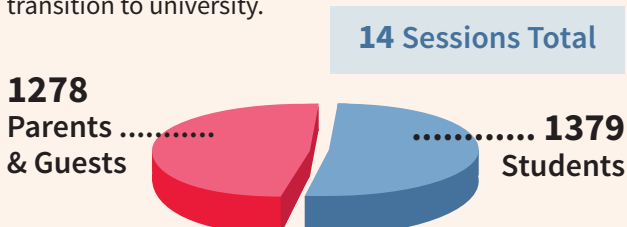
Bounce Back Mentoring Program

Summer Orientation is a one day program for new students and their families, designed to ease students' transition to university.



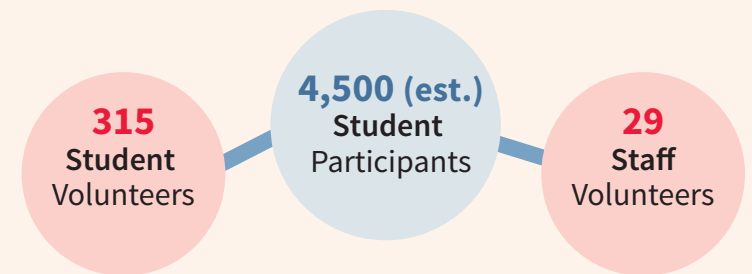
Fall Orientation

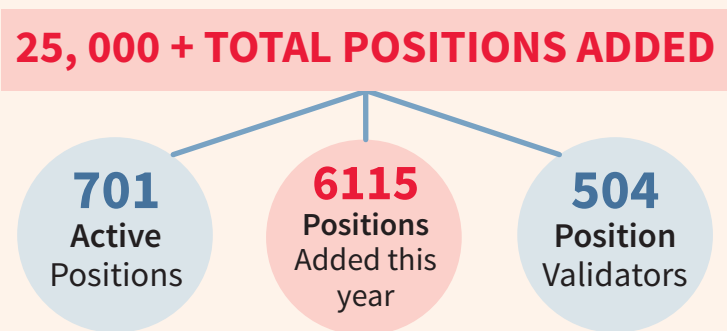
SOAR! Student Leadership Conference

The CCR recognizes undergraduate and graduate students' involvement outside of the classroom. Students can add positions to their record, which is used to showcase students' extracurricular involvement.

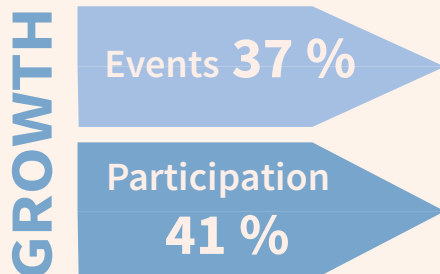


Campus Activity Board

CAB hosts regular events on campus. It is student driven with students planning, promoting, executing and overseeing many diverse events.



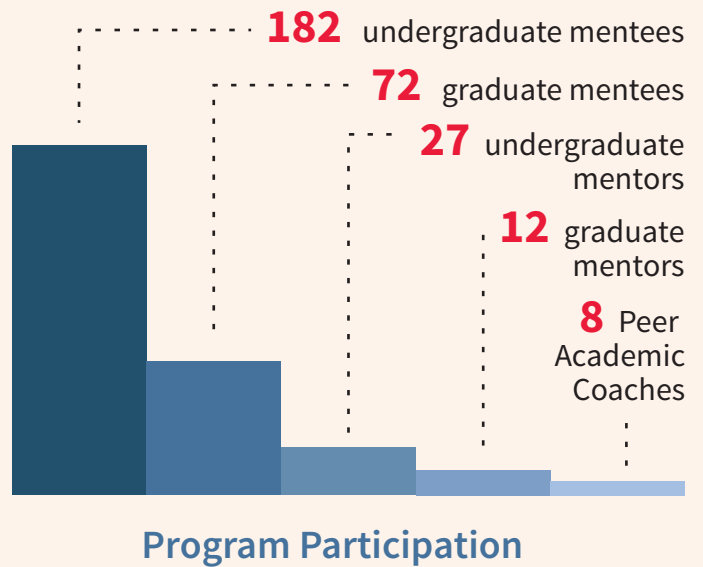

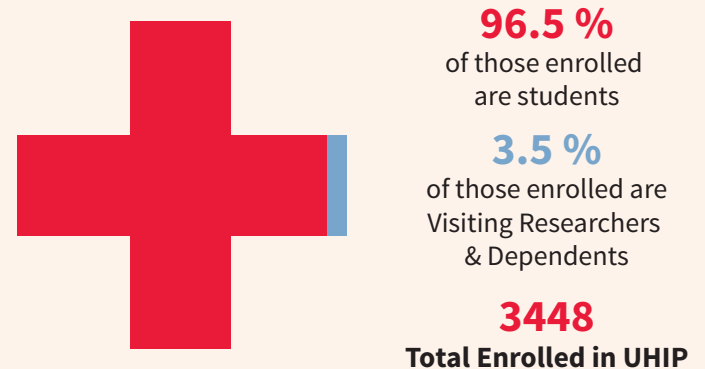
International Student Mentoring

UHIP offers basic health care insurance to international and exchange students, visiting researchers and staff members who do not have provincial health coverage.

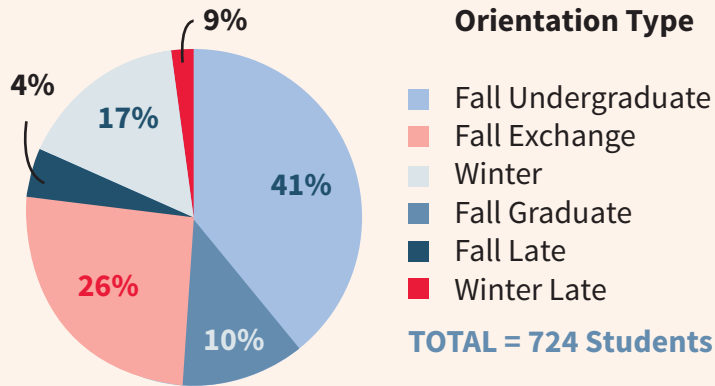


Immigration Support

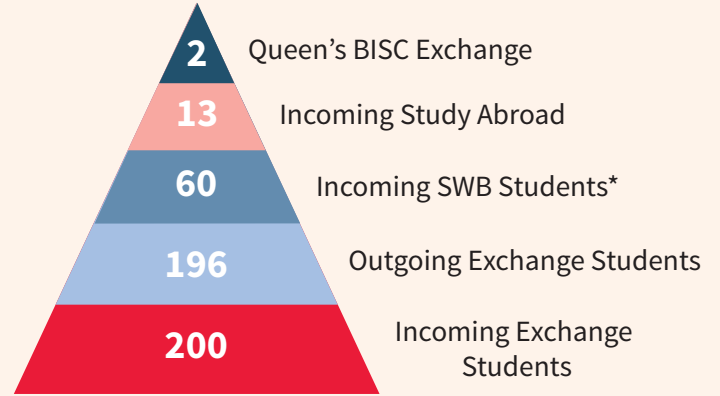
International Student Orientation

Student Exchange & Study Programs

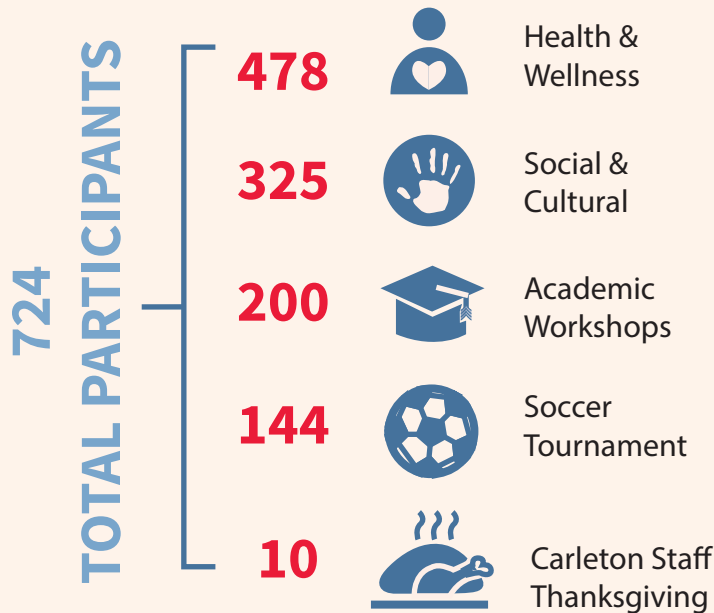
The Student Exchange programs at Carleton offers students an opportunity to study abroad at one of our 180+ partner institutions.

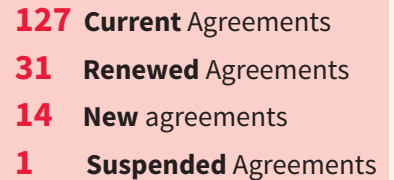
Intercultural Programs and Activities

Exchange Agreements

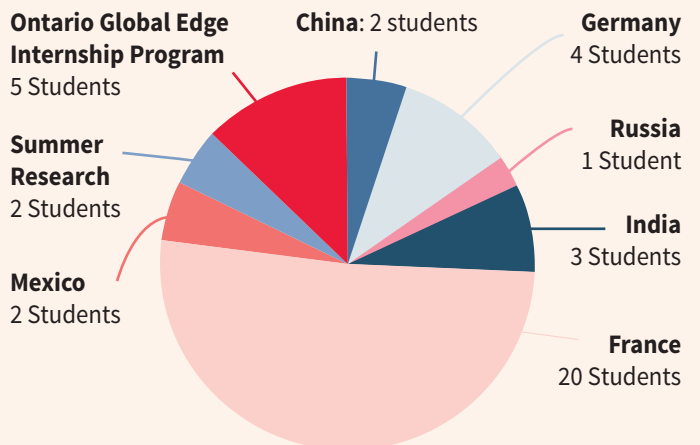
The ISSO administers exchange agreements with universities across the world that enable students exchanges between Carleton and its partner institutions.
