PURPOSE OF THIS COURSE:

This course is designed to achieve two goals. The first goal is to deepen students' historical understanding of the religion and state divisions within Canadian public life today; in particular, by studying the historical background to the constitutional settlement in Canada and the theological traditions on which that historical evolution and understanding of the relationship between religion and state are based. The second goal is to study some of the public law dimensions of contemporary religion and state relations in Canada after the Charter. Although theological and religious views are voiced on a wide variety of legal issues today, the course will focus on those issues which are immediately derived from the written constitution.

The course will trace the historical evolution in constitutional law from the unified vision of Western Christendom through the divisions of Christianity into competing denominations to the religiously pluralistic society of twenty-first century Canada.
