If you have ever asked these kinds of questions, then you might be interested in visiting the Language and Brain Laboratory at Carleton University.

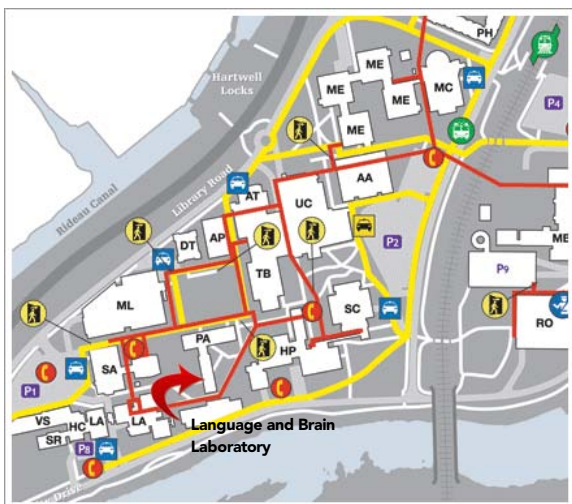
