## **Description of the Field**

Several forces are driving the increasing demand for skilled workers in international trade including the growing global economy and subsequent expansion of trade and the internalization of Canadian business. Companies and entrepreneurs have changed their domestically focused activities to now consider the global economy as a viable and profitable challenge. In addition to employment possibilities in the growing export business, career opportunities are also expanding for Canadians as import agents and specialists who can help foreign-based companies compete in the Canadian market.

Trade policy and promotion activities typically include the collection and analysis of market information, the dissemination of information on export financing, the representing of business interests with officials of foreign governments and international organizations, identifying joint ventures partners and foreign research and development projects, and understanding of foreign standards, testing and certification requirements.

Research and developing policy to illustrate economic behaviour and trade patterns, analysis to determine economic growth, and advising government agencies on policies to increase trade, are among activities related to this area. Cross cultural competence is a valuable attribute.
