

Carleton's MCURES Key Performance Indicators (KPI) – 2023/24

The Ministry of Colleges, Universities, Research Excellence and Security has identified three Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for Ontario Universities: the 7-year Graduation Rate, Employment Rates of Undergraduates (6 months and 2 years after graduation).

Graduation Rate

The graduation rate used for 2023/24 is based on the cohort of students who entered in the fall of 2016 as new, full-time, undergraduate first-year students. For Carleton, this graduation rate was 70.9%.

Employment Rates

MCURES annually commissions the Ontario Graduate Survey in order to estimate employment rates of university graduates. For the survey of 2021 Graduates, 1,774 Carleton graduates responded for a response rate of 34.5%.

Two years after graduating, 93.4% of Carleton graduates were employed, and 88.4% were employed after six months.

Graduation Rates based on Fall 2016 new first-year, full-time undergraduate students.

Employment Rates based on the Carleton results from the Ontario Graduate Survey of 2021 graduates. This survey had a response rate of 34.5%. Overall, the error rate for Carleton's total employment rates are estimated to be 1.88% (19 times out of 20). At the program level, the error rates can be much higher, especially where the programs are small or response rate is low.
