- "Generally, rape is not planned . . . It just happens"
- "One reason that women falsely report a rape is that they frequently have a need to call attention to themselves"
- "Rape is unlikely to happen in the woman's own familiar neighborhood"

"she took a tough attitude toward other people's indulgences"






## **Attitudes in Social Psychology**


- "Degree to which a person has a favorable or unfavorable evaluation or appraisal of the behavior" (Ajzen, 1991)
- Attitudes = evaluations
