Professor Mukandi will speak about African subjectivity, conceptions of African identity and the rupture brought about by the Middle Passage and Colonialism. Drawing on African Philosophy and Black Studies, Mukandi argues for a conception of African identity that, while respectful of heritage and origins, ultimately grows out of the movements and reverberations across the constellation of African worlds. He argues that not only do these pan-African reverberations make us who we are, they are also key to our survival.

Dr. Bryan Mukandi is visiting from the University of Queensland's School of Languages and Cultures in Australia.
