Course(s) for which contract instructors are currently being sought are:

AFRI 2003 [0.5 credit] The Great Lakes Region of Africa, Fall Term 2024

The economic, social and political challenges facing the Great Lake Regions of Africa, including the 1994 Rwanda genocide and its aftermath. These countries may be discussed: Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda.

(Lecture three hours a week) .

AFRI 1002 [0.5 credit] Introduction to African Studies II Winter Term 2025

Introduction to contemporary political, economic, and social dimensions of Africa.

(Lecture two hours a week).

AFRI 2002 [0.5 credit] Horn of Africa, Winter Term 2025

The economic, social and political challenges facing the Horn of Africa, placing them in historical and global context. These countries may be discussed: Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Somalia, Sudan, South Sudan. (Lecture three hours a week).
