Saverio Krätli is the editor of *Nomadic Peoples*. Trained first in Philosophy (University of Bologna) and Anthropology of Development (University of Sussex), he received his PhD in 2007 at the Institute of Development Studies (Sussex) with a dissertation on the cattle-breeding system amongst the Wodaabe in Niger. He has done research in Kenya, Uganda, Ethiopia, Sudan, Niger, Chad and Mongolia on a range of topics, including theory of pastoralism, policy analysis, service provision to mobile pastoral producers, pastoralist production & livelihood, and drylands variability as an asset.
