

Helen and Douglas Nicholson Science Entrance Bursary

Terms and Eligibility

Awarded annually to deserving students entering a Bachelor of Science degree at Carleton University. Eligible students will be Canadian Citizens or permanent residents of Canada (landed immigrant or a protected person) and must demonstrate financial need. This bursary is intended to covers the cost of tuition and fees plus \$1,000 for labs and books.

This award is valued at full tuition plus \$1,000 for the 2022-23 academic year. Only one bursary will be awarded.

Application Deadline: April 2, 2022

Successful candidate will be notified in writing by end of May

General Eligibility Criteria

- Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person
- Student entering the first year of full-time undergraduate study at Carleton in the Bachelor of Science Degree
- Pursuing post-secondary studies for the first time
- Demonstrate financial need
- Demonstrate academic promise, leadership and participation in extra-curricular secondary school activities, community service or volunteer work.
- Minimum admission average of 75%
