Terms

Awarded annually to an Indigenous student in demonstrated financial need who is entering any undergraduate program of study within the Sprott School of Business at Carleton University. This bursary may be continued for 3 years of full-time enrollment provided the students remains in good academic standing and continues to demonstrate financial need. Application is required. Endowed in 2020 through the generosity of Humphrey Law, BComm/57. Revised 2022.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be an Indigenous student that has applied and been offered admission to the School of Business (Bachelorof Commerce or Bachelor of International Business)
- · Applicant must be entering the first year of the program and pursuing post-secondary studies for the first time
- Applicant must demonstrate financial need (by completing and submitting the application form)
