The Government of Ontario has established the Ontario - First Nations Resource Development Scholarship to support students attending Ontario's publicly assisted colleges and universities. The scholarships are awarded to students through their college or university.

The scholarship is valued up to a maximum of tuition and ancillary fees, less any external funding, and up to an additional \$1,250. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

Who is eligible

- Applicant must be a status or non-status First Nations student who is a member or connected to a First Nations community in Ontario
- Applicant must be enrolled full-time or part-time in one of the following undergraduate or graduate degree programs at Carleton University:
 - Earth Sciences:
 - Earth Science
 - Earth Science and Physical Geography
 - Earth Science with a concentration in Physical Geography
 - Masters in Earth Sciences
 - Environmental Science:
 - Environmental Science with a concentration in Earth Sciences
 - Environmental Science with a concentration in Ecology, Biodiversity and Conservation
 - Environmental Science with a concentration in Geomatics
 - Environmental Science with a concentration in Chemistry
