

# CARLETON COURSE TAUGHT ABROAD GINS 3300 (0.5 CREDITS), GLOBAL AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES ABROAD TOPIC FOR SUMMER 2020: POLICY AND DECISION MAKING IN THE GLOBAL SOUTH: ETHIOPIA

The challenges that exist in the Global South, particularly the so-called Least Developed Countries, may appear to be straight-forward and addressable. For example, ensuring all people have access to basic health services; ensuring people have access to clean water and electricity, ensuring access to primary and secondary education, protecting citizens and the economy with stability and security, protecting the environment, and so forth. Yet, these challenges persist. This course will explore policy and decision making to understand the complexities of ensuring the basic needs of all people are met. We will meet with officials at multiple levels of government (federal, regional, zonal, district, community) as well as the international agencies (African Union, United Nations Economic Commission for Africa). We will also meet with NGO leaders and the Canadian Embassy. This course should provide you with an in-depth understanding, from multiple perspectives, about the opportunities, challenges and trade-offs of policy and decision making in the Global South.
