WHAT IS AN INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

 Study full-time at a partner institution for a single semester (fall or winter) or for a full academic year

 Exchange students pay tuition to their home institution (Carleton University)

 Credits earned at the partner may be transferred back toward their Carleton degree

WHERE CAN I GO ON EXCHANGE?

• 175 + partner institutions in 35+ countries

WHAT TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING AN INSTITUTION

- The language(s) of instruction.
- Semester start and end dates (including exams). Not all partner institutions
 follow the same academic year as Carleton. It is very important to
 consider approximate start and end dates when planning for your
 exchange. Winter term is more common amongst BGInS students
- The school's academic strengths
- Your travel interests.
- Restrictions. Not all our exchange agreements are open to all students.
- Estimated cost of living (and travel expenses).

PLAN TO BUDGET

- The cost for international exchange can be high (> \$5,000).
- Students are responsible for their costs:
 - Airfare (both ways)
 - Travel insurance
 - Accommodation and living expenses
 - Student visa/permit, etc.



FUNDING YOUR EXCHANGE PROGRAM

<u>Killam Fellowships Program (United States)</u>

- Undergraduate only
- Minimum 10.0 CGPA required
- \$5000 USD scholarship for one semester
- \$750 USD health insurance allowance
- Up to \$800 USD for in-country travel
- Killam Orientation in Ottawa, ON
- Spring Seminar in Washington, DC

Scotiabank Scholarship

- \$4000 awarded annually to one student
- Must be studying in a country in which Scotiabank operates

Awards and Financial Aid

- Carleton entrance or in-course scholarship
- Carleton bursary
- Ontario Student Assistance Plan (OSAP)
- Student Assistance Plans of other provinces
- CU Exchange/International Experience Bursary

IER Bursary

- All BGInS students are eligible, but amounts will vary according to need.
- Bursaries are valued at \$500-\$2500.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Undergraduate students must meet the following requirements at the time of application:
 - be registered full-time with minimum 2nd year standing
 - have completed at least 4.0 credits (one full academic year) at Carleton
 - have a minimum Overall CGPA of 7.0 (for general exchange program) and a minimum Overall CGPA of 10.0 for the Killam Fellowship Program.
 - apply 1 year in advance (e.g. apply in 2nd year to go on exchange in 3rd year)

*** All students (especially upper year students) must have enough credits remaining in their degree program to study full-time at the partner institution.

BEFORE YOU APPLY



- Determine your eligibility
- Meet with your departmental program advisor
- Attend one of the mandatory exchange information sessions
- Research and identify the institution in which you are interested (at least 3)
- Select your study period

2020-2021 EXCHANGE APPLICATION

- General Exchange Program:
 - Opens: on October 7, 2019.
 - Closes: on December 4, 2019 at 4:00pm
- Killam Exchange Program:
 - Complete Outgoing International Exchange Application on Carleton Central by December 4, 2019 at 4:00pm
 - 2. Submit Killam Application package in person to ISSO by January 15, 2020
- OUI Exchange Program (includes OJS, ORA, OBW, OIN):
 - Complete Outgoing International Exchange Application on Carleton Central by December 4, 2019 at 4:00pm
 - 2. Submit OUI Application package in person to ISSO by January 15, 2020

HOW TO APPLY

- 1. Visit <u>carleton.ca/myexchange</u> for application information and instructions
- 2. Apply on: Carleton Central → Student Online Applications → Outgoing International Exchange Application
- 3. Identify three (3) Partner Institutions
- 4. Academic References
- 5. Consent to publish
- 6. Short-answer assessment questions
- 7. Submit additional supporting documents (if required)
- 8. Application fee (\$ 80.00 non-refundable)
- 9. Wait for a Decision
- 10. Accept/ Decline the exchange offer

WHAT'S NEXT?

- Attend the MANDATORY pre-departure orientation session
- Create a travel registry record on Carleton Central
- Upload your supporting documents by the appropriate deadlines
 - Consular report
 - Consent to publish
 - Certificate of arrival
 - Certificate of departure
- Update your emergency contact information on Carleton Central
- International SOS
 - Sign up on internationalsos.com/members
 - Download the free Assistance App from app.internationalsos.com



CREDIT TRANSFER

Pass/Fail System

- Letter grades will <u>not</u> appear on Carleton transcript and will only show as a pass or fail
- A failed course on exchange will now earn a grade of UNS, which does not impact the Carleton CGPA, just as a passing grade (EXC) also does not impact the CGPA. However, a grade of UNS will count toward students' discredits (to learn more about the Discredit Limit, please visit your departmental advisor and/or the Academic Advising Centre in 302 TB
- Find a balance between academic studies and cultural experience

TRANSCRIPT

- Only one official transcript will be automatically sent from the host institution
- If the ISSO receives a hard copy, we will notify you by email for pick up
- One copy of the transcript must be provided to the the Registrar's Office/graduate department to update your student record
- If applying to graduate school or a job application in the future for personal reasons, request your own copies of the transcript from the host institution (grades will appear!)
