

Language Requirement registration information for **Bachelor of Journalism and Humanities**

Requirement

In the BJHUM you must become proficient in a language other than English at the **Intermediate** level.

Common choices for a second language are Greek, Latin, French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish, or Hebrew, but any language other than English is acceptable.

Your first year BJHUM course registration is affected by your current proficiency in the language you will use to satisfy your requirement.

Instructions

Decide which language you wish to use to satisfy your requirement. If needed, write the Carleton placement test in that language (see below).

The placement test will tell you one of three things:

1. You **are not** proficient enough to start an Intermediate course.
2. You **are** proficient enough to start an Intermediate course.
3. You are **already proficient** at an Intermediate level.

Follow the corresponding registration advice:

- 1. You are not proficient enough to start an Intermediate course.**

You should register in 1.0 credits in Beginner's level language courses so that in your second year you can register in the Intermediate level of that language.

In order to make room in your schedule for 1.0 credits in Beginner's courses, do not register in RELI 1731 or HUMS 1005.

2 You are proficient enough to start an Intermediate course.

For your first year registration you **must** register in RELI 1731 and HUMS 1005.

You will register in 1.0 credit in Intermediate language courses in your second year.

3 You are already proficient at an Intermediate level.

For your first year registration you **must** register in RELI 1731 and HUMS 1005.

You can apply to have your language requirement waived, and replaced with a free elective in your second year of study. Make an appointment in September with the Undergraduate Advisor in Humanities to arrange for this.

Placement Tests

French: You must write an online self-assessment placement test before enrolling in any French course at Carleton, even if you have had no previous French instruction. You can only write this test once.

Modern Languages other than French: You must write a placement test before registering in modern language courses at Carleton if you have any previous training in that language. If you are an absolute beginner, you don't have to write a placement test. The exception is Arabic, for which you must always write a placement test.

List of common Beginner level courses

Greek: GREK 1005 and GREK 1006

Latin: LATN 1005 and LATN 1006

French: FREN 1001 [1.0] and FREN 1002 [1.0]*

German: GERM 1010 and GERM 1020 or GERM 1110 [1.0]

Italian: ITAL 1010 and ITAL 1020 or ITAL 1110 [1.0]

Russian: RUSS 1010 and RUSS 1020 or RUSS 1110 [1.0]

Spanish: SPAN 1010 and SPAN 1020 or SPAN 1110 [1.0]

Hebrew: HEBR 1011/RELI 1011 [1.0]

Arabic: ARAB 1110 [1.0]

*Note that the prerequisite for the Intermediate FREN 1100 [1.0] is Low Intermediate FREN 1002 [1.0]. If you begin from absolute zero in FREN 1001 [1.0] you may have to complete 2.0 credits in French before enrolling in the Intermediate FREN 1100 [1.0].

Latin: LATN 2200 and LATN 2201

French: FREN 1100 [1.0] or FREN 2100 [1.0]

German: GERM 2010 and GERM 2020 or GERM 2110 [1.0]

Italian: ITAL 2010 and ITAL 2020 or ITAL 2110 [1.0]

Russian: RUSS 2010 and RUSS 2020 or RUSS 2110 [1.0]

Spanish: SPAN 2010 and SPAN 2020 or SPAN 2110 [1.0]

Hebrew: HEBR 2011/RELI 2011 [1.0]

Arabic: ARAB 2110 [1.0]

Summer French Immersion

Students studying French should consider the Explore (myexplore.ca) summer immersion program.
