- 6.5 credits are Specialization credits chosen in the student's particular area of focus,

Not Included in the Major CGPA

- 5.5 credits are designated courses in a selected number of disciplines,
- 4.5 credits are free electives.

The normal sequence for completion, for students entering the program in September 2026 onwards, is as follows, set out by specialization. First-year requirements are common for all BPAPM students, and students must select a specialization at the end of year one.

Language requirement:

All students in the Bachelor of Public Affairs and Policy Management Program are required to achieve intermediate-level proficiency in French prior to graduation from the program. Our French proficiency requirement can be satisfied in one of the following ways:

1. Students can meet the proficiency requirement by taking French courses at Carleton. In order to meet the intermediate-level proficiency requirement, students need to pass FREN 1100. Students should note that they will be required to use their elective credits if they choose to take FREN courses.
2. Students can take a French proficiency test with a faculty member in the French department at Carleton.
3. Students can present a DELF certificate at the level of B1 or above.

Students who decide to pursue a specialization in International Policy Studies are required to graduate with either:

1. Advanced proficiency in French (FREN 2100 recommended) **or**,
2. Intermediate Proficiency in both French and another foreign language. This can be achieved by taking FREN 1100 as well as 1.0 credit in another foreign language at the first year level (ie, SPAN 1010 and SPAN 1020). **Please note:** Students must take the full 1.0 credit in the same language. We will not allow students to take a half credit in two different languages to fulfill this requirement (ie, SPAN 1010 and CHIN 1010 is not an acceptable combination).
