COURSE DESCRIPTION / INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course examines various approaches to the study of Canada. Students will learn about the rise and evolution of interdisciplinary Canadian Studies as an academic discipline and encounter key concepts for studying Canadian issues. You will see how interdisciplinary teaching and research differ from traditional academic disciplines, producing a stronger and richer explanation of Canadian phenomena. You will also work on strengthening your research skills.

In the end, you will develop tools for explaining Canada through critical questioning and analysis. ***Our goal is to explain Canada, not to criticize or celebrate Canada or Canadians.*** This course prepares you to pursue the study of Canada in Canadian Studies, Indigenous Studies, and related disciplines.
