From National Security to Political Candidacy: My Journey and 10 Key Lessons from Running with the New Democratic Party in Ottawa South

Huda Mukbil is a security consultant and national security instructor at the University of Ottawa. She is also the author of "Agent of Change: My Life Fighting Terrorists, Spies, and Institutional Racism," which encapsulates her extensive experience working at the Canadian Security Intelligence Service and insights into national security and institutional reform.

In 2021, Huda ventured into the political arena as a federal candidate for the New Democratic Party in the national election. Contesting in a traditionally Liberal stronghold, she significantly impacted her first political run, garnering over 11,000 votes, which accounted for more than 19% of the total vote share. Passionate about equity, particularly for women and racialized individuals, Huda inspires others to seek office and make a difference. Her journey from intelligence to politics, underpinned by her dedication to challenging institutional racism and advocating for equitable representation in national security, positions her as a trailblazer and a voice for positive change in both the public and political spheres.
