

Jean Monnet Network in EU-Canada Relations

Research Internships in Canada

Application Deadline May 30



The Jean Monnet Network on EU-Canada Relations (hereafter The Network), housed at Carleton University, invites applications for two-month research internships at Carleton University in Ottawa Canada in late summer/fall from eligible graduate students at partner universities of the Network (University of Antwerp, Technical University Darmstadt, Technical University Munich, University of Latvia). These internships are co-funded by a grant from the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union. Depending on the availability of funding the following internship positions are available:

- 1) One or two internship positions to support a web-based information portal relating to Ukraine. The intern(s) will do research, collect information, and develop materials regarding cooperation between Canada and Europe in responding to the Russian's war against Ukraine. The interns will work under the supervision of Prof. Viju-Miljusevic and other Carleton faculty. The intern will be expected to play an active role in developing the project. Time of the internship should fall between mid-August and the end of October.
- 2) One internship position to support compiling audiovisual resources for the textbook, *European Union Governance and Policy: A Canadian Perspective*, 2nd edition, under the supervision of Prof. Achim Hurrelmann in the Department of Political Science. Good knowledge of the EU political system is required; familiarity with Wordpress and/or online video platforms would be an asset. The time of the internship should fall between Aug. 8 and the end of October 2022.

Alongside the above duties, the intern will have the option of spending about half of the time pursuing their own research projects. Carleton staff will assist with the location of relevant experts.

A stipend is offered to reimburse transatlantic airfare (based on actual costs up to a specified limit) and to cover most reasonable onsite living expenses.

Eligibility

All applicants need to be enrolled and in good standing in a graduate program at a Network partner university. Applicants should have some background and research interests in EU/European studies and/or in areas of specialization listed above.

Applications should include a resume and a letter explaining the following: the reasons for your interest in the internship, any relevant experience of qualifications, and an indication of when you would like to complete the internship. Your application must be recommended by faculty of the EU-Canada Network at your university. (Here is a list of associated faculty: <https://carleton.ca/caneunet/all-researchers-staff/>)

Applications should be submitted by May 30, 2022 Application materials should be sent by email to the following address, CanadaEU@carleton.ca. Your email should have the title line *Canada internship grant application, YOURNAME* and include one PDF attachment that contains your letter, and resume. The letter of recommendation should be sent separately to the same address by the faculty member writing the letter. By submitting an application, the applicant is agreeing to have application materials shared with the Carleton University.

Please note: Internship and associated grants are conditional on travel being permitted under the applicable COVID-19 travel rules and relevant COVID-policies issued by Carleton University, the student's home university, the Government of Canada at the time of the trip. Relevant COVID policies must be followed. Further conditions are attached to the dispensing of awarded funds, of which you will be notified if a grant is awarded.
