

Jean Monnet Network in EU-Canada Relations

Research Internships in EU Studies and EU-Canada Relations



The Jean Monnet Network on EU-Canada Relations (hereafter The Network, www.carleton.ca/caneunet) invites graduate students working with scholars associated with the Network at the following universities to apply for one European internship: Dalhousie University, McGill University, University of British Columbia, University of Ottawa, University of Victoria (see <https://carleton.ca/caneunet/network-team-by-module/>). The two-month research internship is in summer/fall 2019, with the following European university and theme:

- **Technical University of Munich, Germany (between July 2019 - December 2019):** EU as an Actor in Global Governance; Accountability in EU Governance; Politicization of EU Trade Politics; EU as a trade power; Contestation of EU trade governance; EU climate change policy; EU environmental policy; EU Energy Transition; EU Sustainable Development Goals.

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be enrolled and in good standing in a graduate program at their home university during the time of the internship and unless otherwise stated will be required to be registered in the relevant academic term.
- Applicant should be working with a faculty member associated with the Jean Monnet Network (for a list of Network members see <https://carleton.ca/caneunet/network-team-by-module/>).
- Applicant should have background in EU studies.
- The internship should make a demonstrable contribution to the focus of the student's graduate studies or research project.
- The student's research interests should relate to one of themes indicated in this list above.

The Internship:

The intern will work under the supervision of faculty at the partner institution. Duties will vary by internship but may include working as part of an existing research team, assisting the supervising faculty member, or pursuing the student's own research project. A stipend is offered to reimburse transatlantic airfare (based on actual costs up to a specified limit) and to help cover onsite living expenses. Certain rules apply and all expenses must be approved in advance. All applicants need to be enrolled in a graduate program at their home university during the time of the internship and unless otherwise stated will be required to be registered in the relevant term.

Application should include:

- a letter explaining the reasons for your interest in the program, how you meet eligibility criteria, how the internship relates to your research interests/project and relevant experience or qualifications;
- a letter of reference from the faculty member associated with the Network at your university. For a list of associated faculty see <https://carleton.ca/caneunet/network-team-by-module/>; additional references may be requested; and,
- a resume.

Application materials will be sent by email to CanadaEU@carleton.ca. Your email should have the subject title line *Europe internship grant application, YOURNAME_YOURUNIVERSITY* and include one PDF attachment containing your letter, explanation of research and resume. The letter of reference should be sent separately by the referee directly to this address. Application may be submitted at any time but no later than **May 5, 2019**. By submitting an application, the applicant is agreeing to have application materials shared with the European partner organization.
