

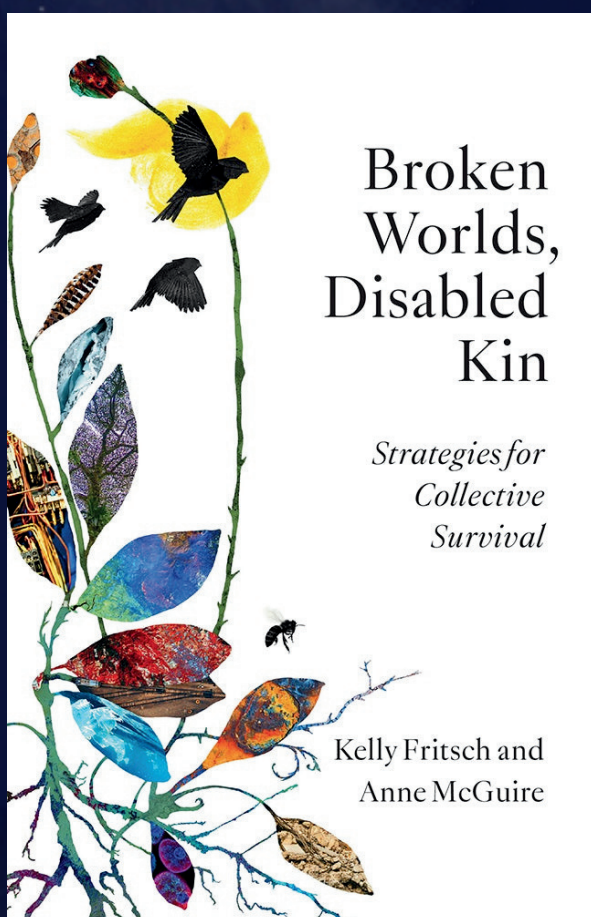
Broken Worlds, Disabled Kin:
