Europe's Changing Borders

Christopher Rumford is Senior Lecturer in Political Sociology in the Department of Politics and International Relations, Royal Holloway, University of London. He is currently a visiting scholar at Carleton's Centre for European Studies. His research interests are in the fields of European studies, border studies, globalization, and cosmopolitanism. His publications include *Rethinking Europe: Social Theory and the Implications of Europeanization* (with Gerard Delanty) and *The European Union: a Political Sociology*. Recent articles include, 'Does Europe have cosmopolitan borders', and 'Globalization and the postwesternization of world cricket'.

The theme of the talk is the dynamic nature of EU borders. The speaker will cover topics such as EU enlargement and the development of borderlands, the increasing securitization of the EU's external borders, 'rebordering' against terrorism and trafficking, and the development of 'networked' borders.
