Transformation, Europeanization and Crisis in Central Eastern Europe

Motivated by the current calamities of democratic capitalism in Central Eastern Europe, the talk seeks to understand how domestic and transnational factors have contributed to the success and failure of transformation from communism to capitalism. Empirically, the talk will be based on the Hungarian and Latvian examples, these being the first countries of the region that had to turn to the International Monetary Fund in 2008.

Dorothee Bohle is Associate Professor at the Political Science Department at Central European University, Budapest, and currently also a Visiting Fellow at the department of Social and Political Science at European University, Florence. Professor Bohle is a Visiting Scholar at the Centre for European Studies, Carleton University.
