EU Issues Conference: Call for Proposals

Overview of the Conference:

As part of the Jean Monnet Project ***Studying EU in Canadian High Schools***, a one-day conference will be hosted at Carleton University on **April 12, 2018** for high school students. The conference focuses on important topics and issues relating to the European Union. The target audience is high school students studying international business, world issues, history, economics and politics in the Ottawa area. The workshop will include a keynote speaker and a series of one hour presentations by graduate students.



This event is co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union and supported by Carleton University with additional funding from the Government of Ontario Ministry of Research and Innovation.

Submission Requirements for Proposals

The selection of topics is a competitive process. The deadline to submit a proposed topic is **February 26, 2018**. Submissions are encouraged from MA and PhD students in European, Russian and Eurasian Studies, History, Political Science, Economics, International Affairs and other related subject fields.

The goal of the conference is to educate high school students on EU-related topics to expand their interest and knowledge of European affairs. Proposals should include a title, objective, a general overview, and learning outcomes (one page); indicate if there will be any interactive exercises within the presentation; and if any equipment, supplies or handouts will be required. The presentation will be one hour in length and include time for a question/answer period. Additionally, please submit a CV, a list of related coursework completed in the field of European Studies, and the contact information of an academic reference.
