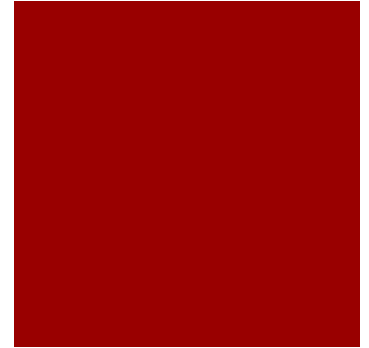
Objectives

- Achieve peace by integrating rebel groups into the ceasefire
- Reconciliations between the parties
- Increasing dialogue and civil society building
- Fostering access by the international community



Project:

- Funding Centre for Humanitarian Dialogue, as a neutral third party facilitator
- Provides “good offices” enabling access to various government and opposition representatives/stakeholders
- Building relationships and gathering information required to advance the peace process
- 2 Years commitment



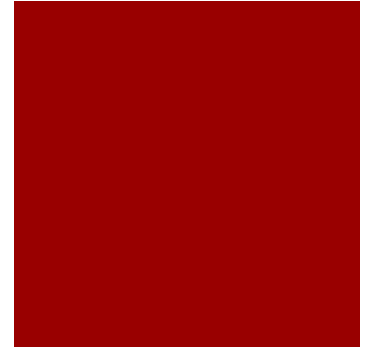
Evaluation and Performance



- **What will they get:** good offices, improved political climate, dialogue, reconciliation and improved humanitarian assistance
- **Performance measurements (short term):**
Memorandum of Understanding with government
Number of meetings, who is he meeting with, long term goal, ceasefire. Increase in public meetings.
- **Evaluation:** Self reporting, reports, expense claims. Gather information from other people such as NGOs, Human rights watch.
- **Follow on Activities:** Follow with an official fact finding mission, engage with rebels, facilitate ceasefire.

Risks

- Paranoid Government
- Mistrust between the ethnic groups
- Internal and external spoilers
- Worsening security situation
- Refusal of Government or Rebels to Engage



Causal Model

- Paranoid Government: link sanctions to participation and progress
- Mistrust between ethnic groups: tie humanitarian aid to participation and progress
- Internal and external spoilers: Work with regional organizations and partners
- Worsening security situation: presence of international community
- Leads to ceasefire- hopefully?
