

- Authority: Guns, Gangs, Prisons, & Rule of Law
- Legitimacy: Accountability, Clientelism, Elections
- o Capacity: Tax, Aid, Corruption, & Effectiveness

Central government status

- ➤ HOG rule by decree & ministries
- defunct Chamber
- ➤ no Senate quorum
- expired mandates
- > PHTK & corruption

Peripheral governance

- > institutional deficit
- > political gangsterization
- political party dispersion
- > radio, literacy & misinformation

SECURITY AND CRIME

- Gangs
 - > FRG9, 400 Mawozo, 5-seconds
 - ➤ empowered by "MREs"
- Embedded gangsterization
 - ➤ blurred lines & corruption
 - police capacity & accountability


- Territorial & institutional authority

DEMOGRAPHY AND POPULATION



- High population density
- o Brain and wealth drain
- High rural to Urban migration
- Low life expectancy at birth
- Youth bulge

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Aid dependency
- Undiversified economy
- Informal economy

ENVIRONMENT

- Vulnerability to exogenous shocks
- Large decrease in arable land

ALC ANALYSIS

AUTHORITY

- Deteriorating security situation
- Elite empowerment of gangs
- Understaffed and under trained police force

LEGITIMACY

- State association with gangsterization
- o Governmental corruption
- Protests
- Use of violence to suppress political opposition
- Low output legitimacy

ALC ANALYSIS

CAPACITY

- Capacity trap
- Aid dependency
- Institutional weakness
- Weak infrastructure
- Limited interest in improving capacity



SCENARIOS

BEST CASE

CSO coalition that increases population engagement and leads to democratic elections and an increase in legitimacy and government trust.

WORST CASE

More environmental shocks that further exacerbates the already low economic capacity, G9 overthrows the central government and takes control of the legislative seats.

SCENARIOS

MOST LIKELY

Slight improvement in access to basic services with the help of international aid, gang violence remains severe and embedded

WILD CARD

Terrorist attacks led by gangs or more precisely another assassination of Haitian key leadership, further deepening Haiti's political vacuum
