COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

The topic of CGSC 3201 is human memory. We will focus on the major areas in this area following the metaphor of information flow, from how the basic "machinery" works, to high level topics like "fake news". Although we will focus mostly on behavioural data, we will also frequently cover data from cognitive neuroscience and modelling. At the completion of the course I expect you would have acquired a useful knowledge of how human memory works. The course will be delivered in person in a combination of lecture and seminar format.
