

## **Community Engagement Student Support Fund**

The Institute of Criminology and Criminal Justice (ICCJ) celebrates and supports the work of students who demonstrate a commitment to anti-racist and/or decolonial efforts through community engagement. Community engagement is a cornerstone of the research process. The ICCJ has established two Community Engagement Support Funds to be awarded to ICCJ students working on anti-racism and decolonization issues.

The ICCJ has established two Community Engagement Funds:

<u>Fund 3: Anti-racism community engagement:</u> Do you participate in community-based anti-racism initiatives or projects? A \$1000 community engagement support fund will be awarded to one ICCJ student who has undertaken community-based anti-racism work and is currently involved in anti-racism organizing or developing an anti-racism project.

<u>Fund 4: Indigenous and decolonial community engagement:</u> Do you participate in community-based projects that advance decolonial objectives or build Indigenous community networks? A \$1000 community engagement support fund will be awarded to one ICCJ student who has participated in decolonial community-based work or work that advances Indigenous community capacities.

Please provide a 1-2 page letter indicating the fund to which you are applying, describing your community-based anti-racism and decolonial work and how this work informs your studies or commitments going forward. At the time of submission, the applicant must:

- Be a registered ICCJ student in their 1<sup>st</sup> year or higher.
- Be in good academic standing

**Note**: Recipients must maintain registration (part/full time) throughout the academic year upon receiving the award. Preference will be given to Black, Indigenous and/or Racialized students.
