CRIME ANALYST

Responsibilities:

The Crime Analyst is responsible and accountable to the Detective, Investigative Response Unit for the efficient and timely performance of the assigned duties and responsibilities. Specific responsibilities shall include:

- Use database research techniques on the records management system to analyze and collate for relevant criminal activity, patterns, and trends;
- Prepare written reports and appropriate charts, maps, and matrixes with respect to criminal activities and trends;
- Apply statistical and research methods to assist officers with current investigations, identifying current crime patterns, and predict future criminal behavior and trends;
- Use formulae and functions and mathematical functions in the analysis of crime trends;
- Liaise with police agencies, community groups, and others in identifying local and regional crime trends and patterns;
- Provide training and make presentations to staff and the public;
- Testify in court as required;

Qualifications

- Three year university degree – Criminology/Sociology recommended;
- Training or experience in using Microsoft Excel in the analysis of data;
- Ability to use the Structured Query Language (SQL) recommended;
- Required to use formulae, functions, and statistical operations in the analysis of data;
- Required to resolve non-routine problems and make decisions involving interpreting and analyzing different factors;
- Strong computer skills including the ability to install, configure, and utilize data analysis software.
- Selected applicants will be required to complete a qualification exam.

Salary starts at \$55,388 to a maximum in 30 months of \$74,977 plus benefits package as per the Civilian Working Agreement. Hours of duty: 40 hours per week. (Salary and benefits are non-negotiable.)
