Welcome New Criminology Students! Here are some Important Things to Know:

Registration

- Generally, full-time students enroll in 2.5 credits per term (5.0 credits per year). See an advisor to make a completion plan if you choose to do a lighter course load.
- CRCJ 1000[0.5] is taken in only ONE term, either the fall OR winter.
- Register for BOTH fall and winter courses when your time ticket opens. DO NOT WAIT to do your winter schedule, as courses will fill.

Field Placement

Acceptance in the placement practicum course is very competitive. To qualify in your upper years, you must do well in your 1st and 2nd year mandatory courses.
