Confidentiality & Research: a project on ethical scholarly inquiry

Project overview:

This collaborative project between the Institute of Criminology and Criminal Justice, Carleton University and Department of Criminology, University of Ottawa has been examining the importance of promises of confidentiality within qualitative research projects focused on criminalized and socially sanctioned issues. The project aims to develop evidence-based practices to help inform and facilitate the protection of confidentiality in future research projects focused on illegal, social sanctioned, or stigmatized issues in Canada. The project will be conducting research with people who have participated in research about their experiences, perceptions, and the significance they ascribe to the promise of confidentiality.

Tasks:

- Implement rigorous data protection protocols (training provided)
- Research coordination and logistics
- Conduct interviews
- De-identify interview transcripts
- Code interview data

Requirements:

- Must be an Carleton University MA or PhD student.
- A familiarity with criminology.
- Qualitative research skills, and qualitative data management, including NVivo.
- Background, knowledge, and/or interest in data protection, research with criminalized populations.

Funding and timelines:

- 112 hours from April 01, 2021 to July 30, 2021 (4 months, 7 hours a week)
