

## **Research Student Support Funding**

The Institute of Criminology and Criminal Justice (ICCJ) celebrates your accomplishment in pursuing a Criminology undergraduate degree. Intending to support students interested in furthering their knowledge and commitments against structural racism and colonization, the ICCJ has established two Research Support Funds. Each fund of \$1000 will be awarded to students working on issues of anti-racism and decolonization; which can include, but is not limited to, research undertaken for courses, written course papers, planned research to be taken this year, research undertaken with work or volunteer positions, research conducted for your own interests or commitments, aspirational research plans for your future.

The ICCJ has established two Research Support Funds:

Fund 1: Anti-racism research: A \$1000 Research Support Fund will be awarded to one ICCJ student who can demonstrate a passion for anti-racism research.

Fund 2: Indigenous, decolonial research: A \$1000 Research Support Fund will be awarded to one ICCJ student who can demonstrate sustained commitment to research that supports Indigenous self-determination and/or efforts at decolonization. Students should demonstrate how their research commitments advance Indigenous sovereignty and/or work against colonial systems of governance.

Please provide a 1-2 page letter indicating the fund to which you are applying, describing what you have learned as a Criminology student at the ICCJ, and explaining how you intend to use this knowledge to engage in future research that explores an anti-racist or decolonial framework.

At the time of submission, the applicant must:

- Be a registered ICCJ student in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year or higher.
- Be in good academic standing

**Note:** Recipients must maintain registration (part/full time) throughout the academic year upon receiving the award. Preference will be given to Black, Indigenous and/or Racialized students.
