Your participation is voluntary, and you are free to withdraw at any time before the end of the survey. If you decide to withdraw from the survey before it is complete, your responses will be discarded (i.e., only complete surveys will be used in the analysis). Should you choose to not participate in the subsequent phases of the study, your data will be discarded.
