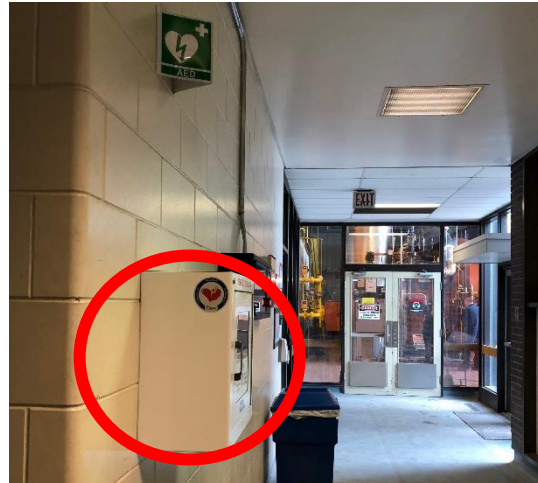


An AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is a device that automatically analyzes heart rhythms and advises the operator to deliver an electric current if the heart is in ventricular fibrillation, an otherwise fatal rhythm. No special training is required to operate an AED.

As part of the Ottawa Paramedic Service's Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) program, Carleton University has acquired 8 AEDs. Their locations are indicated below.

Maintenance Building

Outside the Central Heating Plant (1st floor), across from the street entrance.



Richcraft Hall

2nd floor. On wall bordering the patio in the Atrium. Directly beside a fire hose cabinet.



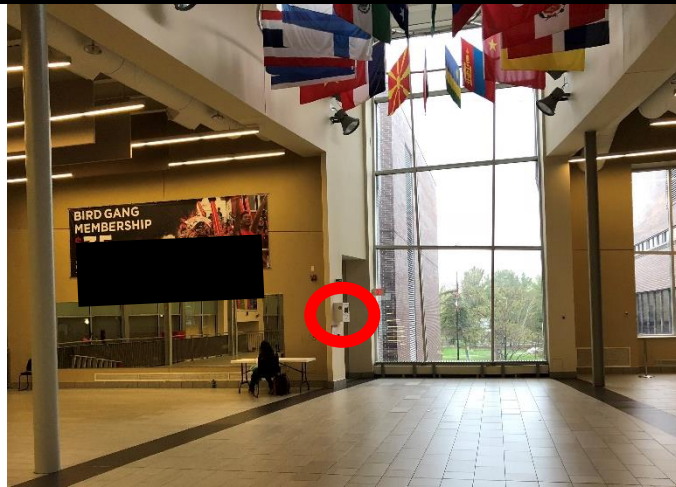
Steacie Building

1st floor lobby. Directly across from main entrance door.



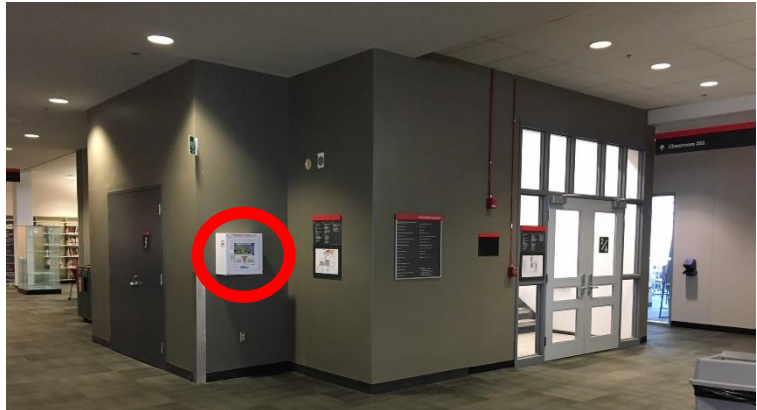
University Centre
