Course Description: An intensive writing course focusing on the formulation and construction of a literary essay. Note: this is not an ESL course.

Specific Course Focus: In this section, we will learn how to critically read short stories and create analytical essays which are supported by various methods of interpretation. Students will be introduced to literary strategies which will equip them to develop university level literary essays.
