ESP Mentors are former ESP students and current Carleton students who work closely with students in
an ESP first-year seminar (FYSM), providing peer support and encouragement. Mentors meet students in regularly with the aim of creating a sense of community in the program, fostering safer learning spaces and supporting students to explore and achieve their goals. Mentors support learning in FYSM classes and act as role models. Mentors promote student attendance in FYSMs and workshops and use of ESP program resources including coaching.
 Participate in ESP orientation to welcome new students Attend mandatory mentor training sessions in August and throughout the academic year (Sept-Apr) Demonstrate reliability through excellent attendance and follow-through Attend assigned seminar classes and communicate regularly with FYSM Instructor Make regular announcements for students in FYSM regarding important deadlines, ESP and campus resources, and social events Meet with students one-on-one Support ESP students to attain academic goals by listening, being a positive role model and referring to resources when needed Cultivate a consistent presence for ESP students Maintain effective communication with Mentor Coordinator and Administrator Organize and/or attend meetings and events to address the needs of their mentees
 Gain exposure to professional environment focusing on student support Strengthen professional skills Develop empathy and tactfulness supporting students one-on-one and provide thoughtful connection to additional resources Hone judgement skills by escalating concerns as needed Expand ability to collaborate effectively with peers and supervisors (responsiveness, follow-through, tactful communication, etc.) Receive specialized training related to "helping professions", such as Motivational Interviewing, crisis and support training, stress management techniques, etc. Participate in career-readiness training
