

EURUS Internship Program

Winter 2024

Basics

- Internship: at minimum 12 weeks, 1 day/week
 - Course: EURR 4206/5301, 0.5 credits
 - Max 15 students
- ! Internship placement is mandatory to register in the course
- ! Internship completion is mandatory to receive a course credit

Process

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Step 1: submit application by October 31

Step 2: attend individual consultation and revise your resume (First week of November)

Step 3: apply for internship placements offered by EURUS or find your own placement (November/December)

Step 4: once placement is confirmed, register in [EURR 5301/4206](#) (sample syllabus) – (December/January)

Step 5: begin your internship

Internships

- Internship offerings vary from year to year based on students' interests and organisations' availability
- EURUS offers a limited number of placements, and students accepted in the internship program can apply to those
 - The process is competitive, since more than one student may apply to the same internship
 - You are encouraged to **seek your own placements to maximize your chances of securing a placement**
 - You can reject only one internship offer, and cannot ask an organization to wait for your decision until you complete interviews with other organizations
