Immerse yourself in the study of Europe, Russia, and Eurasia at Canada's first centre of its kind, the Institute of European, Russian and Eurasian Studies (EURUS). For over fifty years, we have offered students a rich academic perspective of this region through our Master of Arts (MA) degree in European, Russian and Eurasian Studies.

You will receive a unique interdisciplinary experience, combining history, politics, economics, language and culture with area-specific expertise. Our small, close-knit department allows students to train in a dynamic atmosphere, build relationships and networks, and access numerous opportunities.

Choose from two interdisciplinary concentrations:

- European and European Union Studies, focusing on European and EU topics
- Russian and Eurasian Studies, focusing on the Eurasian region and the nations of the former USSR

In addition to our MA degree, EURUS also offers a Graduate Diploma (GDip) in European, Russian and Eurasian Studies and a Dual Master's degree in collaboration with the Université Catholique de Louvain in Louvain-la-Neuve, Belgium. No matter your academic path, you'll study, work, and network in a community unmatched and unrivaled countrywide.

GAIN AN INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE

EURUS encourages our students to develop their regional knowledge and interests with international experiences. As your academic perspective grows, you can pursue opportunities to work, perform research, study, and immerse yourself in the region — through in-person, virtual, or hybrid global opportunities.

Explore the European Union with the “European Study Tour”

- Embark on a multi-week, in-person tour of Europe
- Meet with representatives of the EU’s administrative and political leadership (including the European Commission, Parliament, Court of Justice, and Central Bank)
- Engage with European organizations, including NATO and the Canadian Mission to the EU
- Learn from world leaders based in key European locations, such as Brussels, Strasbourg, Luxembourg, and Frankfurt
- Pursue an internship with an EU institution or European organization after the tour

They may also publish in the EURUS-affiliated *Canadian Journal of European and Russian Studies* (CJERS), an online academic journal that promotes research articles related to the European Union or former Soviet Union states.

EURUS is associated with research centres such as the Centre for European Studies (CES) at Carleton. You can take advantage of research opportunities in Canada and abroad with CES grants.

STRENGTHEN PROFESSIONAL SKILLS WITH OUR CO-OP AND INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

EURUS offers a co-op option for our MA students, presenting an invaluable way to gain work experience, make local connections, and build vital skills for your future career. Students complete co-op terms at various institutions, including within the federal government, embassies, NGOs, international organizations, and private sector companies and firms.

LANGUAGES

Our students approach the region not only from historical, political, and economic angles, but from a cultural perspective as well. EURUS places high emphasis on language abilities — all our MA candidates demonstrate proficiency in a regional language upon reaching graduation.

Not yet fluent in a regional language?

Our students meet our language proficiency requirements in a variety of ways. You can complete coursework through Carleton’s language faculties, make use of department tutoring services, or engage in self-directed study.

We encourage our students to pursue language study in their region of choice through summer programs and in-person or virtual “study abroad” initiatives, and we offer funding opportunities to support these pursuits.

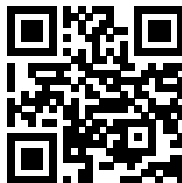
